# **Thomas Bush Named Interim Senior Pastor**

At the Sept. 24 Quarterly Business Meeting, the congregation accepted the resignation of Senior Pastor Mark Pavola and approved Thomas E. Bush to serve as interim (open ended) senior pastor at Bayside Baptist Church. Both changes are immediate; however, Pavola will remain as an associate pastor until Nov. 5.

Pavola has served as senior pastor at Bayside Baptist Church for the past eight years. He resigned to serve God as a church planter/missionary.

Bush, 37, has served as Youth Ministry pastor since March 13, 2006. Sitting at a table in the kitchenette at the church, Bush

talked about the changes he will have in his new role, God's leading in the future and how he came to be at Bayside Baptist Church. As senior pastor, Bush will be less involved with the youth ministry and more involved in leadership training and development. He said that he would be

"I will develop lessons for the youth and come up with events, such as football tournaments, retreats and perhaps a mission trip," Tunell said. "One of the challenges is that there are a lot of kids in the youth group, and it is hard to get them on the same schedule. They are very busy, and it is hard to get them here on Wednesday nights. That makes it hard to get them deeper into the lessons."

One of Tunell's goals is to get the youth more involved in church services and with the adults as well. He will encourage parents to disciple their kids and to encourage them to engage in Bayside Baptist more.

"We'll also engage kids who regularly attend Bayside Baptist to encourage others who don't come so often," he added.

Tunell, a lifelong Superior resident, graduated in 2015 from Superior High School. Since graduation he has lived in Chicago, attending Moody Bible Institute. During his year as Youth Ministry intern, he will continue to study online through the institute, graduating in the Summer 2019 with a degree in Biblical Studies. The internship at Bayside Baptist Church will credit to his degree.

Tunell said he became a Christian when he was 4 years old through his involvement with CEF® (Child Evangelism Fellowship). He participated in CEF's Mailbox Club where he would receive lessons in the mail that he would complete and then mail back.

"The last question of every lesson was, 'Have you trusted Jesus as your Savior?'," he said. "I didn't understand what that meant, so I always checked 'No.' My mom helped me with the lessons, so one time I asked her what that question meant. She explained that Christ died for my sins, that I was in need of Him and that He loved me. That week I checked 'Yes'."

Tunell has been married to Priscilla for 3 ½ months. His parents are Dave and Barb Tunell; he has three siblings: Allyse, Jase, and Luke.

# Children's Ministry Offers a Variety of Programs for Bayside Kids


Children's Ministry Director, Sarah Bush

One of the ladies who is very active in the Healing Ministry is our parish nurse, Ruth Juntune. Ruth has served at Bayside in this capacity for the past five years.

Ruth is well qualified as she attended Prairie Bible Institute in Three Hills, Alberta, did her nurse's training in Whitby, Ontario, and got her bachelor of science degree from St. Francis in Joliet, Ill. She practiced her nursing career for 38 years in hospitals in both Duluth and Thunder Bay, Ontario, before retiring in 2006. To become a parish nurse, Ruth attended the Parish Nurse Prep Course from Concordia College.

What is a parish nurse?" A parish nurse combines nursing and faith to provide an approach to health and wellness that focuses on body, soul and spirit. Ruth has been able to do this in our faith community by providing services, such as: FirstPlace4Health (a 12-week weight loss program) and Living Well with Chronic Conditions (a six-week class). She has facilitated Honoring Choices sessions (to help those needing to set up a living will), an informational class on essential oils and a blood drive.

Usually on the second Sunday of every month, you can find Ruth in the fellowship hall after the morning service doing blood pressure checks. She desires to be available to anyone who may need support or counsel during a health issue.

# A Not-so-Trivial Pursuit of the Bible

A quick search of the Internet provides a wealth of interesting Biblical facts. For example, the Bible was written between 1400 B.C. and A.D. 100 – a span of 1,500 years and more than 40 generations. There were more than 40 God-inspired authors, including kings, peasants, philosophers, fishermen, poets, statesmen and scholars. They were men from all walks of life.

The Bible was written from a wide variety of places, such as the wilderness, dungeons and palaces; during war and peace; and its authors experienced varied emotions such as the heights of joy and depths of despair.

The books of the Bible were written on three continents: Asia, Africa and Europe and in three languages: Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek. The Bible has been translated, in part or in whole, into more than 1,200 languages and dialects. The first translation of the English Bible was begun by John Wycliffe and completed by John Purvey in 1388. In 1228, Stephen Langton divided the Bible into chapters, with the Old Testament verse divisions being done by R. Nathan in 1488 and the New Testament by Robert Stephanus in 1551.

The longest book of the Old Testament is Psalms and the longest book in the New Testament is Luke. The longest chapter in the Bible is Psalm 119 and the shortest chapter is Psalm 117. And everyone who has memorized verses for Sunday school knows that the shortest verse in the Bible is John 11:35 -- "Jesus wept." The longest verse is Esther 8:9.

see our congregation be enabled to serve. I'd like to build depth in our ministry. The challenge for me is balancing my time and my schedule and learning the new nuances of this job which is going to be different from what I currently do.

"I am excited about how God is leading Bayside and taking us into the future. I am excited about the opportunity He is giving me to continue serving and shepherding at Bayside Baptist. I have a desire to stay for a long time."

#### A winding road to Bayside

Being born in Edmonton, Alberta, Bush had a long and winding route to Superior, Wis. Bush said his dad was a pastor, so the family moved from Edmonton to Portland to Vancouver to Minneapolis and then to Muskegon, Mich., where he graduated from Reeth-Puffer High School in 1999. He graduated in 2003 from a small Church of Christ college in York, Neb., with a bachelor of arts degree in Communications and a minor in Biblical Studies.

"When I came to Bayside, I was young," Bush said. "I had worked one year as a youth director at Crossroads Christian Church in St. Cloud and had worked at camps while in college. So, Bayside was taking a chance on a guy without a lot of experience."

Part of Bush's hiring package was allowing him and helping him get his master's and seminary degrees from Bethel University and Seminary in St. Paul. The in-ministry program allowed Bush to work full time while studying online and spending twoweeks twice a year at the school. He graduated in 2010 with master of arts degree in Transformational Leadership.

In March 2006 when Bayside Baptist hired Bush as Youth Ministry pastor, it had not had a youth director who had stayed more than two years. According to Bush, the church was seeking a leader who would bring consistency and a long-term effort to the Youth Ministry.

"My wife and I were seeking a home where we could raise our family," he said. "When we came, all we had was a one-

year-old puppy. Now we have four kids, a 12-year-old dog and a 2-year-old puppy. We found that home at Bayside in Superior where we continue to raise our kids.

"And, I believe the Youth Ministry now has that consistency that it never had for a long time. There were about 150 kids in the youth group with about 80 attending regularly," he added. "But, I found the youth group was about a mile wide and an inch deep. They didn't have depth to their knowledge of God."

Bush's heart and philosophy was building depth into the discipleship of the youth. The focus became less on fun and games and more on the Word and Bible studies which builds the foundations they need to not fall away when they graduate.

Bush's favorite chapter in the Bible is Romans 8, with his favorite verse being verse 28: "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." (ESV)

### Spiritual journey began at home

Being raised with a dad who was a pastor, Bush grew up around the Bible. He said their house was built on God's foundation and the foundation of the Word.

"We went to church. I don't ever remember skipping church," he added. "On vacation, we would go to church in the town where we were. If we stayed home for vacation, we would go to another church in the community. I put

my faith in Christ as a very early age, around 5 or 6. I always believed, always had faith," he said.

But, as a teenager, Bush said he made some poor choices, even though he didn't stray away and he continued to go to church. Then, when he was about 19, the Lord used some people in his life. They saw leadership capabilities in him and gave him an opportunity to speak at a Bible camp to 150 of his peers.

"God openly called me out," Bush said, "He said, 'How can you speak to 150 of your peers when you were out drinking and partying around?' Ultimately, I went up before my peers and read Psalm 51 and told them I was going to stop doing what I was doing and start living the way I should be living. Since then I have been a fully committed disciple of Christ."

Bush met his wife, Sarah, at Flaming Pine Youth Camp at Togo, Minn. He was 14 and she was 13. He said that they grew up together as friends, dated some in high school and got serious in college. They have been married 13 years, and have four children: Garrison, 9; Josiah, 8; Cade, 5; and Malia, 1.


Purpose: To provide spiritual and financial support for local mission projects and information to the congregation on all levels of missions and missionaries that our church supports.

# Provisional Church Constitution Presentation Slated for March 2018 Annual Meeting

At the December 2016 Quarterly Board Meeting, a Constitutional Revision Committee (CRC) was elected to identify and to present to the congregation recommendation(s) for revision of the current constitution in consideration of an elder-led model of leadership. Team members include Rich Tunell, who serves as CRC chair, Kevin Boreen, Ruth McCotter, Ray Saari, Corinne Scott, Pastor Mark Pavola and Pastor Tom Bush.

At the Annual Church Meeting in March 2018, the CRC will present a draft of their work to date and will recommend to the congregation the draft be approved to assure it corresponds with the wishes of the church.

Tunell said the CRC spent considerable time studying the Bible and discussing an elder-led church government model.

"When we dropped our personal views about how we thought a church was supposed to be governed and simply studied God's model, it was clear that elder-led was the model God laid out in the New Testament," Tunell said. "An elder-led board has spiritual oversight over the church and shepherds the flock according to I Peter 5: 2.

"We encourage the congregation to study the Scriptures about elder-led governance for the church," he added.

One of the benefits of an elder-led government is that the spiritual work and caring of the church is shared by all elders in a plurality of leadership, rather than overburdening one or two pastors. Deacons, under the oversight of the elders, will carry out the ministries and administration of the church. Leadership training for these positions will start after the next Annual Business Meeting.


